

## TITLE: SEKVISION SONG CONTEST

THEME: Singing, dancing, culture.

COORDINATOR: Fátima Pereiro [fatima.pereiro@eiris.edu.es](mailto:fatima.pereiro@eiris.edu.es)

PARTICIPANTS: One member or team (of up to four students) from each delegation.

SKILLS: live performance.

OBJECTIVES: To offer live musical performances and choreographies, as well as to promote the culture and emblematic monuments of each country.

### FORMAT:

#### Preparation phase:

1. Each of the schools will choose one or more representatives, from among the students of its delegation,.
2. They must choose a song (which does not exceed 3.20 minutes in duration) from a singer or group in their country to do their own version.
3. They have to record their version on an audio track of the song's tune **without vocals**.
4. They will have previously edited a video with images of monuments, landscapes, characters, their school ... and, in all, everything they want to show us about their country and school. This should be in .mov or .mp4 format and 1080p quality.
5. Both the audio and the video should be sent from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> April via Wetransfer to this address: [sekvision@eiris.edu.es](mailto:sekvision@eiris.edu.es)

6. Live performance.

## EVALUATION:

The SEKvision gala will be broadcast via streaming to all schools participating in the InterSEK (whether they participate in the contest or not).

- Once the performances have finished, there will be an interval of 6 hours to allow for the viewing of videos and for voting to take place on Facebook.
- The judges will cast their vote to those that they consider to be the three best performances, awarding 3 points (to the best), 2 points (the second best) and 1 point (to the third option).  
**No country may vote for its own delegation.**
- Singing, choreography and stage performance will be taken into account in the vote.
- Vote count and percentages:
  - a) 50% Eiris International School jury: made up of different teachers from the different delegations.
  - b) 50% Popular vote. Votes of students and teachers from all the delegations who have cast their vote via the Internet.
